Privacy Policy

As developers of **Vocalibrary** App, we value your privacy and protect it in the easiest way; BY **NOT COLLECTING YOUR PERSONAL DATA.**

- We don't collect, store or share any of your personal data such as your name, address, phone number or email address.
- We don't want you to sign up, you don't need a password, you just download and use the App.
- We don't see the contents you uploaded to your App, everything happens on your device.
- We don't measure any statistics from the App, how many words you uploaded or selected is unknown to us.
- We don't know which search page you use the in-App browser or what you searched. We don't record your browsing data.
- We don't use any cookies.
- We won't share your email or any of kind of information that you send through it if you contact us for support, we will just use them to respond you.

There are just a few exceptions we have to mention in this Privacy Policy:

- Our App logs events and errors on your device. For that, we're using Apple Unified Logging technology which highly respects your privacy and we're following recommended best practices to not logging any private data. If you choose to send crash reports, they may include some technical information, such as the device model, processor type, iOS version, the state of some of the App's variables related to the crash, etc.
- Our in-App Browser lets you use several search pages. Note that these external sites are not operated by us. Therefore, we strongly advise you to review the Privacy Policy of these websites. We have no control over and assume no responsibility for the content, privacy policies, or practices of any third-party sites or services.
- When you connect to a remote server or internet to download a data file, your information is being transferred through regular Internet channels. We have no control over

whether or not your cellular or Internet provider, government or private agencies are mining that traffic for sensitive data.

• Our website contains a special user analytics script provided by Google. This script collects some site usage stats, such as how much time you spend on each page, how many links you click, etc. This is the same set of scripts virtually every website out there uses. The collected data is then forwarded to Google and processed. We can then see the processed stats, but what happens with that collected raw data, how it's processed, and whether or not Google shares it with anybody, we don't know.
